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- Background/Aims** ○ In order to overcome issues accompanying the aging of society, such as increasing healthcare and welfare needs, Fukuoka City launched the Fukuoka 100 Project as an initiative for creating a sustainable social model for anyone and everyone to live a full life in good health.
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- Project Outline** ○ The Fukuoka 100 Project is a project that encompasses not only healthcare, medical care, and nursing care, but also community-building initiatives in a broad sense, including housing, community-building, and working styles, with not only government agencies but also a wide range of actors—local residents, businesses, and universities—working in collaboration to promote the project.
- Representative Initiatives
- Community-building initiatives that enable people with dementia or who require nursing care to live with peace of mind
  - Supporting shopping through mobile street stalls and temporary retail outlets
  - Supporting generation of opportunities for matching elderly people’s occupations with companies
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- Features** ○ The project is applying the strengths of local industry as an information industry hub to efforts to respond to the aging of society.
- Not stopping at related industries such as healthcare, medical care, and nursing care, the project is also promoting collaboration through various actors in fields such as housing, community, schools, and labour environments.
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- Results** ○ The Fukuoka 100 Project aims to implement 100 new initiatives through “All Fukuoka” industry-academia-government-civic collaboration by 2025, and has implemented 70 initiatives as of the end of November 2020.
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
