

To those affected by the disaster 被災者生活再建支援法人（公財）都道府県センター**Information on the Support Grants for Reconstructing Livelihoods of Disaster Victims**

We would like to express our heartfelt sympathy to everyone affected by this recent natural disaster.

The Support Grants for Reconstructing Livelihoods of Disaster Victims is a grant provided to households whose homes have been completely destroyed, or whose livelihood have been severely damaged due to natural disasters, in order to support them in rebuilding their lives.

- ✓ Whether this system applies depends on the extent of the damage in your municipality. If the system becomes applicable, your prefecture will issue a public notice.

1 Overview of the Support Grants for Reconstructing Livelihoods of Disaster Victims**■ Types of Support Grants**

- ① Basic Support Grant: Grant provided according to the degree of damage to the residence
- ② Additional Support Grant: Grant provided according to the method chosen to rebuild the residence

■ Eligible Households

- ① Completely destroyed households ※1
- ② Demolished households (demolition due to half-destruction or land damage) ※2
- ③ Long-term evacuated households ※3
- ④ Large-scale partially destroyed households ※1
- ⑤ Medium-scale partially destroyed households ※1, ※4

※1 The degrees of housing damage—"completely destroyed," "large-scale partially destroyed," "medium-scale partially destroyed," and "half-destroyed"—are indicated on the Disaster Victim Certificate issued by your municipality.

※2 Applies when a house, certified as "half-destroyed," "medium-scale partially destroyed," or "large-scale partially destroyed," or whose land has been damaged, must be demolished due to unavoidable disaster-related reasons—such as posing extreme danger if left as is, or requiring excessively costly repairs.

Note: Partial demolition of a house that has received an official disaster damage assessment is not eligible. The house must be completely demolished.

※3 Certification of long-term evacuated households is carried out by the prefecture.

※4 Medium-scale partially destroyed households are eligible only for the Additional Support Grant (applicable for disasters occurring from the Reiwa Ni-Nen Shichigatsu-Gou 2020 Kyushu Floods onward). However, if the damaged house was demolished due to unavoidable disaster-related reasons, the household may apply for the Basic Support Grant as a "partially destroyed demolished household," as well as for the Additional Support Grant for the difference.

Process from Application to Payment of Support Grants

- ①
The head of the affected household submits the application form with the required documents to the municipal office where they resided at the time of the disaster via one of the following methods: in person, by mail, or electronically (Mynaportal) ※
※ Electronic applications are only available in municipalities that support them.
- ②
After the municipal review, the documents are forwarded to the prefecture.
- ③
After the prefectural review, the documents are then forwarded to the Prefectural Center. (Support Corporation for Reconstructing Livelihoods of Disaster Victims).
- ④
The Prefectural Center conducts the final review. If eligible, a payment notice is issued and the grant is deposited into the bank account of the head of the affected household.

Important!

- Payment cannot be made in cases where the household is a single-person household, or if all members of the household pass away before payment (including after applying). (The right to apply for the grant cannot be inherited.)
- If eligibility is lost or fraudulent receipt is discovered, the organization will request repayment.

3 Application documents

The head of the affected household must complete the application form for the Support Grants for Reconstructing Livelihoods of Disaster Victims, attach the required documents listed below, and submit the application. (For online applications, please enter the required information on the application screen and upload the necessary documents.)

■ For Basic Support Grant (For medium-scale partially destroyed households, only the Additional Support Grant applies)

Required Documents

① Disaster Victim Certificate (issued by the municipality)

※ If applying as a long-term evacuated household, submit a Long-term Evacuation Certificate instead of a Disaster Victim Certificate (Long-term Evacuated Household Certificate: issued by the municipality).

For ②, if the head of household's individual number (My Number) at the time of disaster is filled-in on the application form, submission of the Certificate of Residence (juminhyo) for the head, household members, and anyone sharing the same address may be omitted.

② Copy of the Certificate of Residence (issued by the municipality)

- A copy showing the address, household composition, head of household, and relationships at the time of the disaster is required for all members.

○ If no changes in the household occurred after the disaster → Household Record

○ If there were changes in the household after the disaster such as relocation within the same city or household separation → Revised Original Resident Record (individual resident record with history, Certificate of Residence extract)

○ If you moved to another municipality after the disaster → Record of Removal from the Resident Register (including the address change history if applicable)

For ③, if the applicant checks "Use Public Funds Receiving Account" in the application form and fills in the individual number (My Number) of the head of household at the time of the disaster (or a member of the same household), there is no need to attach a copy of your bankbook. If you wish to use the Public Funds Receiving Account, please confirm that the account has been registered in advance.

③ Copy of Bankbook (provided by the applicant)

- Must show: bank name, branch name, account type, account number (or JP Bank code), and the account holder's name in katakana (head of household or same household member).

Additional Required Documents for Half-destroyed Demolished Household Applications

④ Demolition Certificate (issued by municipality) or Certificate of Building Demolition Registration (issued by the Legal Affairs Bureau)

Additional Required Documents for Demolition Due to Land Damage

④ Demolition Certificate or Certificate of Building Demolition Registration (issued by the Legal Affairs Bureau)

⑤ Documents proving land damage (Emergency risk assessment results for the land, repair construction contract, photos, etc.)

■ For Additional Support Grant

Required Documents

⑥ Copy of contract documents (e.g., construction contract, real estate sales contract, rental contract for the house, etc.)

If no formal contract is made under the "Repair" category → Submit estimate + receipt, order form + order confirmation, etc.

※ 1: Attaching these documents may be omitted if the individual number (My Number) is written on the application form. However, if data linkage errors occur, submission may still be required.

※ 2: During the certification period for long-term evacuated households, you cannot apply for an Additional Support Grant if the reconstruction site is within the certified evacuation area. Furthermore, after the long-term evacuated household certification is lifted, eligibility for the Additional Support Grant will be determined based on the degree of damage to the house. Therefore, documents such as a Disaster Victim Certificate must also be submitted.

4 Important Notes

- You may apply only for the Basic Support Grant first, or submit applications for both Basic and Additional Support Grants at the same time.
- Even if you own the house, you are not eligible unless you lived there as your primary residence. Likewise, for Additional Support Grant, if you do not live in the reconstructed home, you are not eligible.
- For the Additional Support Grant: If you temporarily rent an apartment after the disaster and then build a new home within the application period, you may first apply for “Rental” and subsequently submit a second application under “Construction/Purchase.” (In this case, the second application will be for the difference between the "Rental" amount and the "Construction/Purchase" amount.)
- If you apply under either “Construction/Purchase” or “Repair,” your livelihood reconstruction is considered complete. Therefore, if you applied under “Repair,” you cannot later apply for the difference to “Construction/Purchase.”
